



Children have been dramatically affected by the pandemic



increase in numbers of children calling helplines in highincome countries



Increased time online

75%

Australian children reported increased online engagement



Each day during lockdown, Australian children:

23% spent < 1 hour online 32% spent 1-2 hours online 26% spent 2-4 hours online 13% spent 4-6 hours online 3% spent 6-8 hours online 3% spent >8 hours online



Increased exposure to risks of harm







Tick box, one-off or very short-term


