Care costs and care placements in SA are rising fastest in the country.



54% of all children in SA live in relative disadvantage compared to 39% nationally.





1/3 of all children in SA notified to Child Protection by age 10



15,000 children at risk of long-term contact with the child protection system

- "Many services are funded without a clear practice or program model and without being underpinned by an evidence base."
- "The wisdom of front-line workers should be supplemented by testable, independent research data"

Early Intervention Research Directorate (EIRD)

- Develop an early intervention evidence-base for South Australian Government
- Identify service models with efficacy in promoting the health, safety and wellbeing of children
- Strategy and policy advice to SA Government to guide funding priorities
- Research innovative service models
- Identify evidence-based service models that meet the needs of Aboriginal children and families










Improved understanding of service need

Number of referrals by referral outcome and region, 2022/23








Family complexity at time of referral

Proportion of referrals, 2022/23




Engagement rate by household and risk characteristics, 2021/22



Per cent accepted referrals engaged


Engagement rates by provider type and Aboriginal household

Engagement outcome, 2021/22




Engagement strategies

Unadjusted prevalence ratio of being successfully engaged in Intensive Family Services, 2021/22




Frequency of engagement strategies by outcome




Outcomes for families engaged in IFS

Closure reason for referral/families engaged in service provision, 2021/22




Family Snapshot: Overall Service Effectiveness

School Attendance Concerns








Insights: Domestic and Family Violence - All Referrals 2022/23




Assessing associations between multiple factors

- Better understand of risk/complexity within our population
- We can see the (initial) efficacy of certain strategies
- Two types of explanatory models emerging:
 - Outcomes explained by structural factors
 - Outcomes explained by social factors
